Template survey questions - vaccine experience

May 2021

About this resource

The Government COVID-19 vaccines delivery plan aims to vaccinate tens of millions of people. So far, it has vaccinated a good proportion of the UK's adult population.

We are providing this survey to support feedback of rapid insight to Government and local services about how the vaccine programme is working. You can use these template questions to help you develop a survey to gather information about people's experience of their COVID-19 vaccination appointment, as well as attitudes towards the COVID-19 vaccine and the communications around its rollout. You can adapt or add to these questions as needed, based on your local knowledge, circumstances and stakeholders.

We've focussed these template questions on experience of and communications about COVID-19 vaccinations for two reasons:

- A larger percentage of the population has now received the vaccine, so the survey template has been changed to reflect this fact.
- Surveying experiences and communications more closely will allow you to see what problems may be arising with vaccine appointments and how communications around vaccine appointments could be better delivered. For this reason, it is really important for you to record the demographics of respondents as fully as possible. We have included a full list of options. You should also think about actively targeting communities which research has shown to be more hesitant and sceptical of being vaccinated. Polling for the Royal Society for Public Health has found that people from minority ethnic communities and those from lower income areas are less likely to take up the vaccine.

There is still skip logic included to attitudinal questions for those who are yet to take the vaccine, this may be particularly important for gauging the attitudes of younger people.

How to use this survey

The questions we recommend asking are outlined overleaf. We have also marked in **pink** where you should use the 'logic' functionality of your chosen survey software to enable people to skip questions that no longer relevant.

Skip logic is important for this survey. This is because some people will have received two doses, one dose or no doses of the vaccine. Additionally, some people may have had issues accessing the vaccine whilst others may not have. Skip logic will move them to different parts of the survey accordingly. Analysing the data may be difficult without the use of skip logic.

The following systems have this logic function: Healthwatch website template, SurveyMonkey, SmartSurvey and Google Forms.

Recording demographics for this survey is very important. By recording demographics, you can then draw out any trends by analysing the findings against particular trends. For example, one small age group may have a particular reason for low vaccine confidence. If your online survey tool collects participant's IP addresses, you will need a strong affirmative statement noting this in line with GDPR regulation.
