Background:

• Farming communities were identified as a focus area for our Inclusion Lead.



- A 2021 'Big Farming survey' by the Royal Agricultural Benevolent Institute highlighted issues with access to healthcare for farming communities.
- Local engagement & research showed us that 'access' was still the biggest barrier to farmers seeking healthcare.



 We wanted to look at ways to improve access to Primary Care for farmers.

What we did:

 We facilitated a multi agency working group to look at the issues.



- We presented the results of our initial research to local rural GP practices and PPGs.
- We supported one of the practices to organise, promote and facilitate a walk-in clinic for farmers.
- Using the success of the pilot, we encouraged and supported other rural practices to get involved.



Impact:

 43 farmers attended and received health checks, who would not have otherwise made an appointment. (Total no. registered 164)



 Opportunities to discuss Mental Health or Domestic Abuse have also been included for farming communities through the walk-ins.

- 2 walk-in clinics; 2 re-runs and one new GP practice scheduled; plus 1 MH-only planned.
- The NENC ICB has now included this approach in it's Inclusion Health Framework.



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
